#### Class 1

Class 1 have been finishing off their topic 'Transport and toys', and have also been carrying out Easter activities. The children have been giving each other directions in computing. They have been working out journeys in class and on the playground. They have also been using treasure maps to direct bears and Bee-bots to the buried treasure. The children have carried out printing to make their Easter cards and they look beautiful. They have also been melting chocolate to make Easter nests. We have had a lovely term and I look forward to their achievements in the Summer.

#### Class 2

Class 2 have been designing, making and evaluating Egyptian Shadufs. These are the Egyptian systems for carrying and transporting water. The children's shadufs worked with varying degrees of success! #### Class 3

Class 3 have finished their work in science by investigating the processes used to clean and treat water and also clean up oil spills at sea. It has been interesting to see how some of the procedures that we have undertaken in class 3 are used on a larger scale. In maths Class 3 have been undertaking work on angles, area, and perimeter. Year 6 have enjoyed extra challenges, including calculating the internal angles of regular polygons. In English we have undertaken our final piece of work based on Michael Morgurgo's book Private Peaceful. The creative writing produced by the children has been exceptional. Before this, the children produced biographies which have all proved informative and interesting to read
