We have joined in with reception shapes and explored simple shapes such as circle, square, triangle and rectangle.

Miss Martin has gone Christmas crazy and it's only the 1st day in December. There is Christmas paper chains all over the nursery ceiling, pipe cleaner snowflakes on the windows and snowman collage pictures on the board. But the best bit is the handprint Christmas Tree.

Class one


We have had a very busy fortnight! We have started reading a new book called the Winter's Child. The pictures are beautiful, and the children have thought of some fabulous adjectives to describe the setting. In maths we have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes, we then moved on to direction. The children have been busy describing forwards, backwards, left, and right. We have been using the iPads to take photographs. We have thought about landscape and portrait, focus and light. We have also had fun changing the images. We have all had a messy time weaving baubles for the tree displayed in Much Wenlock church. Please go and see it if you can. We have had two fabulous sports activities. We went to Broseley and also the KS1 children from our Federation got together to carry out Christmas activities. We have also started out Class Advent Calendar. Yum!

Class Two

C2 have been very busy this week preparing for the Cribfest in Much Wenlock church. We have designed our own crib scene using toilet roll inners! Please make sure you make time to see it and our fantastic Christmas tree. We have also been practising our carol 'Child in a Manger Born' for the federation Carol service next Wednesday-we hope you are looking forward to it as much as we are. In Maths this week, we have begun to think about time using the analogue clock. In Literacy we have continued looking at the Firework Makers Daughter with some fantastic pieces of descriptive writing. In DT we have been designing our own shell structures to turn into present boxes. In Science we are finishing our Sound unit by making our own musical instruments-if you have any empty tubes, small boxes or yoghurt pots we would be very grateful. C2 will be taking part in the reverse Advent Calendar during December again. More details to follow!

Class Three

The Dance Festival team have started work on choreographing their dance for the festival in February next year. Our choice of song is 'I Go Swimming' by Peter Gabriel. The children have lots of ideas to try out and are working well as a team. In science we have investigated reflecting light. Creating a narrow beam of light, Class 3 were able to measure angles of incidence and angles of reflection. We have also researched periscopes. We have completed work on fractions, decimals and percentage in maths and have moved onto measure and distance. The Tempest has provided a starting point for our English work again this week -the children have written extracts of Prospero's diary. We have examined historical documents and data on The Battle of Britain in history lessons.

NOTICE TO PARENTS/CARERS SCHOOL ADMISSION ARRANGEMENTS 2025/26

Shropshire Council, as admission authority for community and controlled schools in Shropshire, is conducting a consultation exercise on School Admission Arrangements for 2025/26. The Council is simultaneously coordinating a consultation exercise for own admission authority schools, such as academies, whose governing bodies/trustees are responsible for setting their admission arrangements and who wish to make changes to those arrangements. We wish to notify all parents/carers that the consultation will begin on **4 December 2023** and continue for more than 6 weeks until **19 January 2024**.

The proposed amendment to Shropshire Council's admission arrangements are as follows: St Lawrence CE Primary School in Church Stretton is proposing a reduction to its Published Admission Number from 34 to 30.

Shropshire Council are proposing changes to the in-year admission arrangements from 1st September 2024 for all community and voluntary controlled schools as well as own admission authority schools. Shropshire Council is proposing that the Local Authority be responsible for coordinating in-year applications, as well as retaining responsibility for coordinating main admissions rounds. The proposed coordination represents a significant change from the existing position, where the responsibility for in-year applications is delegated to all Shropshire schools.

Proposed changes to Shropshire's admission authority school arrangements are shown below.

- The Trust-Ed CSAT Alliance is proposing the standardisation of all their Trust policies, the schools below are consulting on the following changes: Alveley Primary School - adding medical and staff criteria Castlefields Primary School, Bridgnorth - adding medical and staff criteria Stokesay Primary School - adding medical and staff criteria St. Leonard's CE Primary School, Bridgnorth - adding medical and staff criteria Church Stretton School - adding medical and staff criteria Mary Webb School & Science College – changing the position of staff criteria Oldbury Wells School - adding medical and changing the position of staff criteria
- Barrow 1618 Primary School removal of faith-related criteria
- Cleobury Mortimer Primary School adding medical criteria
- Clunbury CE Primary School adding medical criteria
- Longden CE Primary School removal of faith criteria, adding staff criteria and changing the position of medical criteria
- Greenacres Primary School adding staff criteria
- St Mary's CE (aided) Primary School adding medical criteria
- Bowbrook Primary School is a new school and a part of the 3-18 Education trust in Shropshire. As the school opened in September 2023, they need to consult on their proposed oversubscription criteria and admissions policy
- Much Wenlock Primary School has joined the 3-18 Education Trust and is proposing to remove medical criteria along with adding staff criteria, bringing the policy in line with those in the rest of the trust
- St Michaels Federation, consisting of Lydbury North CE Primary School and Onny CE Primary School is proposing changing the position of medical criteria
- Our Lady & St Oswald's Catholic Primary School, Oswestry, and St John's Catholic Primary School, Bridgnorth is proposing to give priority to all looked after children and previously looked after children whether or not of Catholic faith
- Idsall School has joined The Marches Academy Trust and is and is proposing to add medical criteria to bring their policy in line with those in the rest of the trust
