

#### **Mrs Hunt**



# **CLASS NEWS**

#### Class 1

Class 1 have been ever so busy!! Our new topic is Transport and Toys. Our new literacy book is the Squirrels Who Squabbled. It is a lovely story, and it teaches us that it is better to work together. The children have been learning about nouns and expanded noun phrases during our grammar lessons. They are brilliant at identifying nouns. In our maths lessons the children have been learning about place value and ordering numbers. Bob the class alien is going on a tour of the 7 continents in geography. This week he found out about France. He is not sure about eating snails! In science we are learning about materials, we have looked at lots of objects and thought carefully about the materials they are made from. We've been on a materials hunt around school and described the properties of each material. Our computing lessons have begun, and we are thinking about following instructions. The children have had fun directing the beebots around the classroom. Have a lovely weekend and get plenty of rest Class 1!

#### Class 2

Welcome back to Class 2-it has been lovely to hear about what everyone got up to over the Christmas break-it all seems like a long time ago now! C2 are already working very hard. We have been looking at extended noun phrases and fronted adverbials in Literacy. Our class read is Varjak Paw by SF Said and is proving to be a great adventure story. In maths we have begun developing our place value skills and Y4s know that they need to develop their times tables knowledge ready for the national times tables check that takes place in June. They all have their log in details for TTRS and should be regularly practising at home as part of their homework. Our science topic is Teeth and Digestion, so we have a few fun experiments coming up-watch this space. We have begun our invasion games theme with Mr Bourton in PE so remember to come in your PE kit on Mondays please!

#### Class 3

Class 3 are enjoying a new book – Cosmic by Frank Cotteral Boyce. Our English lessons are currently based on this text and we have had fun writing in a similar style to the author. Our history this half term focuses on analysing evidence to decide whether the story of the Trojan Horse is an historical fact, legend or classical myth. So far we have examined maps and become familiar with the story. During science we have reviewed the properties materials can have, such as thermal and electrical conductivity. We will be investigating mixtures and reactions over the coming weeks. In maths we have completed our first topic on sequences, rounding and negative numbers. Well done to everyone who cracked the Fibonacci code!

#### Star Mindfulness

Cut out the star. Whenever you need to take some time to be calm or to pause and ponder use it. When you need to use it, simply run your finger along the edge of the star.

On each edge going from the middle to a point, breathe in

On each edge going back from a point into the middle, breathe out again.

A star with five points should take five complete breaths to go all the way around.

Once you have focussed on your breathing, you could use the points to pray for 5 people too. You can put this in your pocket to carry with you so you can use it at any time. What gift would you give Jesus?

#### Classroom Prayer Activity

Prep. gift tags (or post it notes and pens

Somewhere to put the tags an empty wrapped box or a piece of wrapping paper on a board

Give everyone a gift tag (or post it note)

When you have watched the video take your 'tag' back to class.

God uses the stars to guide the wise worshippers to their destination. This song, explores God being in control of the stars yet still being involved in our lives.






This week Bourton Church hosted a Christingle Service.
