# **CLASS NEWS**

### Class 1

Class 1 have been pretending to be squirrels this week in literacy. They have been writing diary entries. Cyril the squirrel gets into all sorts of bother trying to get a pinecone for his winter stores. The children have been writing in the first person about Cyril's adventures. In maths we have been adding and taking away using money. We have been enjoying our new mastering number sessions. We have been on our travels around the world with Bob the class alien. So far we have visited Europe, Asia and Australia. In computing we have been instructing the beebots to travel around our classroom, we have learnt that changing the order of instructions results in a different journey. We have been identifying and sorting materials in our science lessons. A very busy fortnight!

### Class 2

C2 are about to begin their non chronological report about cats. They will be researching facts and note taking. In maths, they are looking at formal addition and subtraction and how to use the facts they have learnt to solve problems. They are also having a focus with times tables on a Friday with Mrs Ross -Year 4 parents -please continue to make sure your children practise their times tables. In Science we have discussed parts of teeth, how to look after our teeth and we are moving onto setting up our experiment about what effects different drinks can have on our teeth, if we don't brush them! Watch this space for the results in a few weeks. In History, we have begun our unit on British history heroes, ask your child about William Wilberforce and why he is a hero?

### Class 3

Class 3 have been examining evidence in an attempt to authenticate the story of the Trojan Horse. As the oldest piece of evidence dates from around 600 years after the story originated, much discussion has been had. In gymnastics we have introduced vaulting to our sequences and the children have had the option of using the springboard. During maths we have tackled multi-step word problems involving addition and subtraction and have now moved on the multiplication and division. In computing we have looked at the 'repeat' command when programming shapes and in RE we have been exploring the Christian understanding of the terms 'Saviour' and 'Messiah'.

# Important parent information regarding the rise in cases of measles

## Please read the information below

Cases of measles are increasing in the UK, including in the West Midlands, and it's likely that there will be cases in Shropshire soon.

Measles is a viral illness that can be serious and sometimes fatal. Spending 15 minutes with someone with measles is enough to get the virus. Symptoms of measles include high fever, runny nose, cough, red and watery eyes, small red spots with a bluish-white centre inside the mouth. A rash can appear later, usually on the face, upper neck, hands and feet, fading after 5 to 6 days. If you've not been vaccinated against measles, you can be at risk, but it's most common in young children. Someone with measles can spread the virus up to 4 days before a rash appears, and up to 4 days after.

Measles can have serious and sometimes fatal consequences, so make sure you and your children are up to date with MMR vaccinations and ask your GP about catch-up jabs if needed. The MMR vaccine is highly effective at protecting against measles.

If you are unsure if your child is up to date with all their routine vaccinations, you can check their Red Book (personal child health record) in the first instance. If you are still not sure, or if you need to bring your child up to date with their vaccines, you should contact their GP practice to check and book an appointment.

If you are concerned that your child has measles, please call your GP in the first instance, to reduce the risk of passing the disease to others in the waiting room. More information on measles can be found <u>here</u> and information on the MMR vaccine can be found <u>here</u>.
