Hello, everyone,

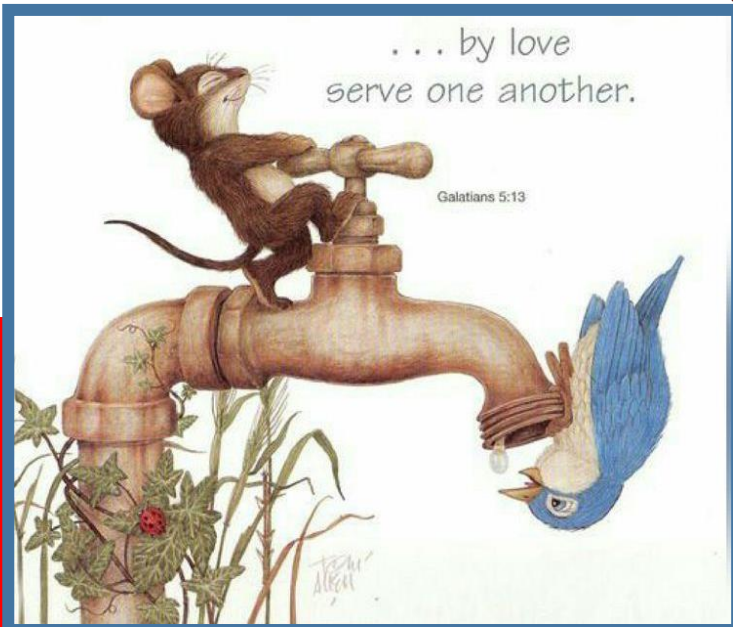

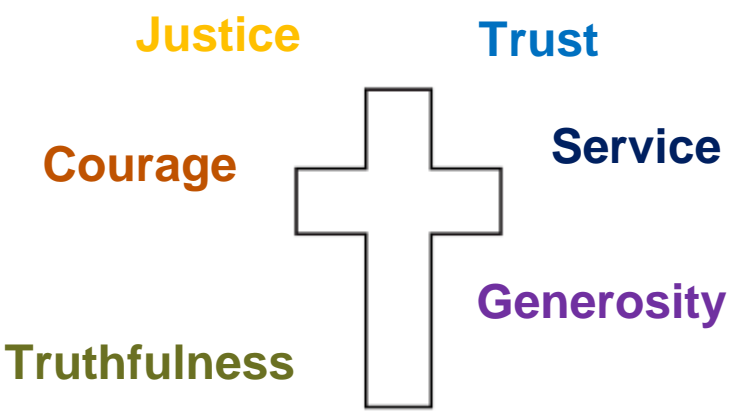

CLASS NEWS

Class 1

Summer has arrived! Thank goodness!

We have had a busy fortnight. In literacy we have been learning about famous buildings around the world. We have learnt about the Burj Khalifa, The Shard and the Great Pyramid of Giza. The children have written a fact file about each building and produced a poster about their favourite building.

In maths we have been linking counting patterns to the times tables. It has helped us to work out the answers to our 2, 5, 10 and 3 times tables more easily.

In R.E we have been learning about the good news gospels. The children have been thinking carefully about the good things that God has given us. Class 1 thought love was the most important.

The Year 2 children have been to William Brookes to join in with sporting activities. They had a wonderful time and were so enthusiastic. Well done Year 2.

Class 2

It has been lovely to welcome the sunny weather this week. Please can you make sure your child has a hat and brings in their water bottle every day.

Well done to everyone who took part in the William Brookes Sports Morning yesterday. We are very proud of C2.

Class two have been very busy. In DT they have using their chopping, cutting, and peeling skills to prepare potatoes ready for mash. Who knew peeling a potato could be so much fun!

We move onto preparing onions and carrots to combine in a Shepherds Pie very soon.

In Literacy we have liked our science work by looking at the work of Greta Thunberg, the famous young climate activist. We planned and wrote out a non-chronological report about her using our best cursive handwriting.

In Maths we have all been looking at shape, different triangles, and quadrilateral properties. In RE we are enjoying finding out about the differences and similarities between Hinduism and Christianity.

Class 3

We have been reading a wonderful book called Journey to the Rive Sea. Using this as inspiration children have been writing a mystery story starting from a secret lagoon.

In geography children have learnt about rivers and especially estuaries, looking at the human and physical features. They have also been considering how to protect estuaries and beaches from human made harm.

In Re we continue looking at WWJD (What Would Jeus Do) and how we treat others.

It's been all about fractions, decimals, and percentages in maths this week. The children have been problem solving and many have grown in confidence. Well done C3

We are really enjoying our theme of 'The Seaside' in Nursery. This week we have been learning about keeping our beaches clean so that animals can be safe there. We have been reading, "Clem and the Crab" by Fiona Lumbers and "Clean up!" by Nathan Bryon and Dapo Adeola. In these stories, the children recycle the plastic that they find at the beach and create art out of it – we are having a go at that too!

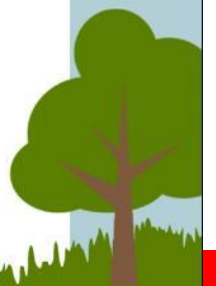
